## COMMUNITY INVITED TO ART RECEPTION FOR LOCAL ARTIST MELISSA RESCH

<u>December 26, 2025 – Sturgeon Bay, Wisconsin –</u> The community is invited to attend a reception on Friday, January 9 from 4:30-6:00 p.m., at the Door County Community Foundation, 222 N 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue in Sturgeon Bay. The reception kicks off the Lobby Gallery

Winter Exhibition featuring works by Door County resident and artist Melissa Resch.

Resch holds a BFA in painting from Massachusetts College of Art & Design and a Masters in painting from University of Tasmania. She has lived on five continents and visited all 50 U.S. states, settling in Door County in 2017. In 2020 she opened her studio at 45 South 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue in Sturgeon Bay.

Inspired by abstract expressionism and mid-century modern style, Resch extracts the essence of familiar objects and places to celebrate fresh ways of viewing them through a variety of mediums: oil painting, works on paper, textile art, and assemblage. Lines and shapes appear, disappear, and reappear to imply architecture, farms, bridges, boats, waterways, shadows, or living creatures. Her work invites open narratives and contemplation about our relationships to spaces we inhabit.

Each season, different Door County artists are invited to exhibit their work at the Door County Community Foundation's Lobby Gallery. The Gallery is normally open to the public during the Community Foundation's regular hours of 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.
